- Encouraging participation from groups currently under-represented
- · Allocating Community Chest funding for local projects
- Attending guarterly Board meetings with local stakeholders
- · Attending tours, training, subgroups, and consultation events for feedback
- · Reviewing literature, communications and messages circulated to the community.

PHASING UPDATE CCC



















This section of the Newsletter will provide you a construction update for the wider regeneration project. This update is focussed on progress made in the past 3 months, as well as the work on site that will be taking place during the remainder of 2024 and into the early parts of 2025.

The most significant works that have either already taken place in 2024, or are forecast to take place into the first guarter of 2025, are set out below:

- · Completion of the allotment move to phase 9.6.
- Demolition of Jerome Tower, Osbourne House and Doyle House
- Commencement of construction on Phase 9.3,5,6
- Opening of Budgens in Phase 9.2
- Commencement of demolition of Carisbrooke Court.

Phase 7.2

Phase 7.2 is located to the north of Avenue Road, with the completed Phase 7.1 to the east and Acton High Street to the north. Proposals are for 185 new homes, including Active Living homes for residents aged over 55, affordable rented homes, and private homes for sale.

This phase also contains the site wide energy centre. Demolition of the existing buildings (Cheltenham Place Block 6 and 8 and Frampton Court) were completed in 2023. Technical design for the phase continues to progress.

Phase 8.1

The two existing buildings in Phase 8.1 are Carisbrooke Court and Ludlow Court. Initial works have already begun on the demolition of Carisbrooke Court in the form of soft stripping the internals of the building. Structural demolition works will follow on from these initial works. Phase 8.1 will deliver a total of 161 new homes including a total of 51 affordable homes. The completion of this phase will conclude Phase 8 at Acton Gardens.

Phase 8.2

Many of you will recall that at the end of 2023, 45 homes in this phase were sold to private rent provider Cheyne Capital. These homes have now been let to private renters under the brand LINA.

25% of the homes purchased by Cheyne are to be held back for key workers with rental discounts of up to 24% of market value, providing a significant benefit for key workers seeking to secure rental properties at Acton Gardens.

The remainder of the phase is already fully occupied.

Phases 9.2

Whilst completion of the homes in 9.2 have been completed for some time, the exciting news for this phasing update is that the Londis that occupies the commercial offering in the phase, opened in December 2024. Parcel Lockers have also been installed outside of Southsea Hights. This will mark the overall completion of the phase.

Londis

Phases 9.3, 9.5 and 9.6

Located adjacent to the recently constructed Phase 9.2 and opposite West Park, Phases 9.3, 9.5 and 9.6 will complete the western quarter of Acton Gardens.

The phase will collectively deliver 215 homes, ranging from 1-bedroom apartments up to 4-bedroom houses. Demolition of Osbourne House and Doyle House has completed, and demolition works of Jerome Tower have reached the basement.

Groundworks have now commenced on parts of the phase including the installation of drainage and services, piling, and preparations for the pouring of the ground floor slab.





The most recent Community Chest Sub-Group Meeting took place on Monday 29 November 2024.

The sub-group were impressed with both the proposals received during this funding round, and ultimately decided to fund both projects – Bollo Arts for Respect project, and The Descendants Week of Dance – both of which clearly demonstrated the breadth and depth benefits for Acton Gardens residents.

The overarching aim of the Bollo Arts for Respect is to work with young people to develop art pieces that explore the concepts of respect and community, to help local youth develop a better understanding of the importance of respect and supportive communities. Through the medium of art, young people will be heard and able to express themselves creatively. It will also provide young people and other residents to have space to develop constructive dialogue and better mutual understanding going forwards.

The Descendants' Week of Dance will provide a dynamic and immersive experience in various dance styles for young people in the February 2025 halfterm, from African and Caribbean traditional dances, to hip-hop and contemporary. We're really excited to see these projects come to life in the near future! Keep an eye out on our website for further details once the projects begin.

In recent months, the Regeneration Team have also been working together with residents, local groups and organisations and the community to explore opportunities to make the Community Chest funding more inclusive and accessible to all residents looking to pursue initiatives that benefit the local community.

As a result of this, the Applicant Guidance Document has been revised and re-published to respond to feedback asking for greater clarity on applicant eligibility, application requirements and overall streamlining and simplification of the document. Thank you to all those who participated in this exercise. We believe the new Guidance Document is an important step forward towards a more relevant and engaging Community Chest programme.

COMMUNITY CHEST SHOWCASE EVENT 2024



In celebration of providing over £500,000 of funding to over 150 local groups and the initiatives that have come out of it, and to raise awareness and accessibility of the Community Chest, the Regeneration Team hosted a Community Chest showcase event at Acton Gardens Community Centre on the 31st of October 2024.

The event was free for local residents and was split into two parts – 1) A Community Chest Information and Networking Session in partnership with Ealing and Hounslow Community Volunteering Service, and 2) Free half term activity sessions for local residents run by previous recipients of Community Chest funding.

Part 1: 11pm to 2pm

We kicked off the day with an information session for prospective applicants, with presentations from the Regeneration Team about the Community Chest and how to apply, as well as presentations from Ealing and Hounslow Community Volunteering Service, followed by Q&A session. We then opened up the space for a networking session, with a full lunch spread.

The aim of the first session was to:

- Teach attendees about the available AG Community Chest grants for local residents, businesses, and charities
- Signpost EHCVS and the support, information and advice they offer for voluntary and community sector groups operating in the borough
- Provide guidance on how to apply for funding
- Hear success stories from past recipients
- Provide the opportunity for participants to ask questions about the Community Chest funding and EHCVS
- Network with local organisations, businesses, and community leaders over a free lunch.

It was great to be able to hear from both prospective and previous applicants in person and also to signpost Ealing and Hounslow Community



Volunteering Service (EHCVS), and we hope to run more events like this in the future.

Part 2: 2pm to 5pm

The activity sessions did a fantastic job of demonstrating the great variety of local talent and resources for local residents.

Carol from StayActive4Life ran a chair exercise session for elderly members of the community in the – energy was high and participants were bringing the moves! **StayActive4Life** deliver a range of classes for older persons across Ealing that: - Build strength and flexibility - Improve balance and co-ordination - Improve mobility and posture. Their Strength and Balance programme is designed specifically to prevent falls and consists of a set of muscle strengthening and balance retraining exercises.

Following this, **YARDO** ran a mix of wellbeing workshops in the main hall with Asia leading a mindful dance workshop and Paula holding a talking stick activity table, whilst Avail Artistry held a Halloween themed balloon modelling workshop. Kids and adults alike got stuck in to making their giant spooky spiders, and it was great to see great big smiles as participants left with their creations.



The day was rounded off with a short film screening of Pattern Pictures CIC, complete with popcorn and Halloween treats. The actors themselves from Bollo Brook Youth Centre came to introduce the work, and it was great to shine a spotlight on the rising talents in of Acton Gardens.

Overall it was a great day, and we look forward to building on the work of the Community Chest and funding even more great projects and local groups in the future!

Tuesday 1 October marked the United Nations 'International Day of Older Persons' (IDOP). This year, the focus of IDOP was - "Ageing with Dignity: The Importance of Strengthening Care and Support Systems for Older Persons Worldwide"

In line with this theme, the Acton Gardens Regeneration Team wanted to celebrate IDOP by saying a big thank you to some of the organisations who provide vital support to elderly members of the local community and acknowledge the key part that they (and the older persons themselves!) play in enriching the Acton Gardens and South Acton Community.

One way in which we celebrated IDOP, was by preparing 'hug in a mug' gift parcels for members of United Anglo Caribbean Society (UACS) as a token of our appreciation in celebration of IDOP. UACS run a bi-weekly Opportunities, Social & Support club providing nutritious meals, social interaction and







recreational activities, exercise sessions, and cultural and educational activities and trips for elderly members of the Acton Gardens community.

The Regeneration Team regularly visit UACS in Acton Gardens Community Centre and hear first hand what a significant impact they have on helping to reduce social isolation and improve mental and physical wellbeing of residents.

We are excited to continue to strengthen our relationships with and support for the many incredible organisations locally who support the elderly members of the Acton Gardens community, and shine a light on the fantastic work they do.

GROUNDBREAKING CEREMONY

1,000th affordable home to be built as next phases of Acton Gardens regeneration get underway.

Construction has begun at Phases 9.3, 9.5 and 9.6 of Acton Gardens, which will provide a further 215 mixed-tenure homes at Acton Gardens

This milestone was marked in a ceremony held on 4 December, where Ealing Council Leader Peter Mason broke the first ground on the new phases.

With 966 affordable homes (of which 80% are for social rent) delivered across Acton Gardens so far, the new phases will include the delivery of the regeneration's 1000th affordable home.

Designed by Pollard Thomas Edwards Architects, the new phases will provide 215 new homes, of which 50% will be affordable (on a habitable room basis) – reflecting the commitment across the regeneration to deliver 50% affordable housing.

The 215 homes in Phases 9.3, 9.5 and 9.6 will comprise six open market sale houses, 110 open market sale apartments, 24 shared ownership apartments and 67 social rent apartments. With construction now underway, the first new homes are expected to complete in September 2025.

Located adjacent to Phase 9.2 and opposite West Park, these latest phases will complete the western quarter of Acton Gardens, which serves as a gateway to Acton Gardens from Bollo Lane and Acton Town station, which is a five-minute walk away. As well as the new homes, new public spaces are also being created. These include courtyard gardens at both Phases 9.5 and 9.6, as well as private gardens for all new houses in Phase 9.3.

Daniel King, Managing Director of Vistry West London, said:

"The start of construction on Phases 9.3, 9.5 and 9.6 at Acton Gardens is a significant moment that we are proud to mark with our partners at L&Q and Ealing Council. Through the delivery of the 1,000th affordable home, these phases demonstrate how our 50% affordable housing commitment is making a difference, with energy-efficient, high-quality new homes helping to address the urgent housing need in Ealing."

Jacqueline Esimaje-Heath, Growth Director at L&Q, commented:

"We are delighted to mark this huge milestone together with our partners. At L&Q our mission is to deliver homes and neighbourhoods that everyone can be proud of – and not only are we proud of the work we've been doing for the past 10 years, but we are very excited about these future phases."

"Delivering the 1000th affordable home, as well as the significant number of social housing already built on site, reaffirms our commitment to tackling the housing crisis."

BOLLO BROOKE YOUTH CLUB UPDATE

An Update from Colin Brent, Youth Service Area Team Manager, on what has been going on at the Youth Centre over the past few months.

Over the Summer, Bollo Brook Youth Centre ran a busy programme of activities, starting with young people performing, presenting and volunteering at New Gen Festival in Walpole Park, Ealing's Summer festival for and by young people. This included performances by amazing local dance group Elevate Arts.

Next came the making of two short films with two different groups of young people at the Pixipixels's studios on South Acton Trading Estate. The young people were set a challenge to make a film in one day set entirely in a toilet!

From there, we went straight into our Holiday Activities and Food (HAF) programme, with around 80 children and young people attending and taking part in sports and arts activities. Some of the work, such as the customisations of denim jackets and trainers, was displayed at the V&A Museum.

Throughout, we continued to run our weekly youth-led food distribution project, giving out around 50 crates of food to local families and vulnerable residents. Demand has grown significantly over recent months, and for the first time since we started the project in March 2020, we are struggling to provide enough food to everyone. Any donations, especially of dry goods such as tins, pasta, rice and cereals, would be warmly received.


